- Work with existing, and assist with new, local businesses to understand the opportunities that are arising in their industries

INCREASE RESILIENCY

- Identify and take steps to increase the resiliency of infrastructure and service delivery of the jurisdiction
- Update or create a new All Hazards Mitigation Plan to leverage financial support for improvements to increase hazard resiliency
- Document and quantify social resilience resources, identify gaps, and create a plan to expand or create new resources with leadership from the communities with the greatest need
